Coastal fishing charter report

All arrived safely at the Flats Elite accommodation on Friday night and spent time in the Bermagui Country Club replacing fluids after the long drive and enjoying tucker from the large menu whilst listening for their number for the meat raffle.

An early start meant all were up by 5.30 for the 6.30 departure from the dock. Les the skipper and his wife Kathy (deck hand) sorted out bait and gear on the way to Golden Point about 50 mins south of Bermagui. The sea was most pleasant with a swell of about 1.0 mtr and wind not greater than 10 knots all day. We fished between 1 and 4 miles off shore all day targeting the reefs and shale areas for snapper. The skipper was continually moving and seeking new spots until we found a productive area where we did a couple of drifts. A mixed bag of fish were caught, wrasse, rock cod (in large numbers mostly caught by Kelly the rock cod queen), snapper (10 no with Steve catching the biggest), flathead, gurnard, mowong, and a few other types of fish. Alex caught a stripy Tuna while trolling between drops which ended up as fresh bait. All went home with some fish however the bag of fish was not as good as some years previous. I'm not sure if this reflects on the quality of the fisher person?

The special part which made the trip so much more enjoyable was the Eco aspect of Humpbacked whales and seals throughout the day. We must have seen a dozen whales, the occasional breach and the best was a pod of 5 whales not greater than 60 meters from the boat while we were drift fishing, the noise from the whales gave us all a start as it blew beside the boat, the oohs and ahhhs were as memorable as the whales themselves. We were hoping they would breach and show themselves fully as they slowly swam North to their play ground at Hervey Bay, around Fraser island. We also had a very large fur seal follow the boat into the port hoping for a feed as tied up at the end of the day, he didn't get lucky, not enough for him as well.

Drinks and dinner at the pub was enjoyed by all with comments about the quality of the steak. It again wasn't a late night as there was the early morning fishing off the rocks for the dedicated few.

Fly or lure fishing off the rocks Sunday morning as the sun rose was pleasant with Kelly catching the first fish on a slice, a pike, all the subsequent fish caught by all were also pike. Martin caught black fish and small drummer on bait. Les and Geoff went to Blue Holes (swimingpool) and found the salmon using unweighted cut bait, to the envy of most.

A late breakfast at the café and most were on the road by about 11am dispersing to Canberra, the highlands and Sydney.
