Draft Changes to NSW Trout Water

Steve Samuels (president of Monaro Acclimatisation Society and past President NSW CFA) explained why the DPI are working with the acclimatisation societies rather than clubs:

Under the NSW Fisheries Act 1935 the Acclimatisation Societies are the legal custodians of certain areas which have all been gazetted as Acclimatisation Districts for the purposes of Salmonid fisheries. A change to this boundary (which is in effect the trout waters boundary) affects the legislation as it relates to Acclimatisation Societies and the Act and therefore there is a legal requirement for the AC's to be consulted. If AC's do not agree to any changes it will be difficult for the changes to occur as they are underpinned by the 1935 Act, hence the first requirement is to get AC's approval in this instance.

While there may be many other "interested parties" there is a legal requirement for AC's in this proposal.

The MAS will keep other clubs informed as we progress this matter, but rest assured we will not give away 'trout waters' lightly.

In the first instance, Steve advised that the various branches of MAS will be lead for establishing positions on each of the ideas proposed by DPI, but he did particularly cite the Tumut River and Khancoban waters of being of particular concern. Members are invited to provide comments to Secretary CAA. If you have concrete evidence (eg photos) of trout populations in the areas being removed, please pass them on. Meantime, I offer my comments (already passed to Steve):

- The changes for Queanbeyan River in effect change only 1km immediately below the dam wall with "environmental releases" I'm unsure if this is a realistic tailrace water and thus the change is possibly of little consequence.
- The proposal for Tumut means all the waters around Tumut township which we regularly fish would become general waters, including Blowering Reservoir. This is possibly the most significant proposal in respect to CAA activities. Very successful outings to Tumut have shown the large number of trout resident in these waters.
- The change to rules of Shoalhaven effectively mean that the Mongarlowe will revert to general waters. Whilst I have had limited success, I have had a number of occasions sight fishing to trout on private land and at the headwaters. Reedy Creek is located only a km or so upstream of Mongarlowe so there are no consequences on fishing above Braidwood/Captain's Flat road.
- The change to rules of Snowy bring general waters above the Pinch and Jacob Rivers which I have successfully fished for trout and, whilst low in elevation, are pristine KNP and provided a real alternative to Thredbo etc when based in Jindabyne. The change seems premature in the context of changes to the releases from Lake Jindabyne to rejuvenate the Snowy.
