Caught some nice browns at Yaoak last Thursday (36cm, 33cm, 41cm and 39cm) plus a few smaller rainbows. Failed to secure a decent attachment at yens bay on Thursday night. Was a large hatch of caddis twilight on the lake but fish disappeared on darkness. I do believe one angler directly across the bay however managed to snare a couple of nice fish going by the amount of splashing I heard. Everybody had packed up and left by 1930hrs. Lake was in complete darkness and hadn't had a decent touch for over an hour at that stage.

Eucumbene Weekend

After the damage at our cottages on the Goodradigbee, the club event was moved to the Eucumbene area staying at Providence. Seven members attended for all or part of the weekend. Fishing was pretty hard (at least that's what I felt) with little evidence of the big browns purportedly lining up in the lake for early spawning (though I did spook one brightly coloured fish up near Kiandra – Peter reckoned it to be a brown, though it looked like a rainbow to me!). I offer one image of a smallish brown from the river. Peter was the only successful angler in the evening on the lake with a 52cm brown. Three of us took time out on the Murrumbidgee on the way home, with some success especially on the swing at the end of the drift in somewhat coloured water.

In the end, my total for the weekend was one 32cm brownie on a muddler, not much but my first lake trout. I got in lots of practice casting big flies on a weight forward line.

I came back to Tantangara this Saturday just gone and slightly bit better:

44cm, 36cm, 32cm brown, wooly buggers and a yeti 29, 31, 32 cm rainbow, some antique orange English wet fly about size 8 5cm bass popper with 10 metres of braid attached

I fished Nungar Creek on the way out for 20 minutes:

15cm, 17cm rainbow, Geehi beetle.
