Crown Road Closure Objections

Members may recall that our support was sought from the Monaro Acclimatisation Society in objecting to a number of closures of crown roads providing access to regional trout streams. These crown roads are general unmarked, often unmade, roads that were originally surveyed for development. There is a move within NSW to permit land



owners whose property either adjoin or encompass these roads to purchase them from the government and thus close off access.

In the recent action four roads were the topic of the objection – these were in the Tumut area giving access onto the Tumut River, Goobarragandra River and Gilmore Creek. As it turns out, three of the four objections were upheld. The advice I received from NSW Lands was:

Submission regarding Crown road closure application W456199 & W385592 at Lacmalac

Regarding road closure application W456199 & W385592 being considered for Crown Roads within and adjoining properties south of Goobarragandra River from 154 -722 Little River Road, Little River continuing south to Snowy Mountains Highway (Ref 13/04301).

In relation to Road Closing Application W456199 for Crown Road adjoining western boundary of Lot 213 DP750972, I am pleased to advise that after assessment of all submissions received, the Minister's delegate has **upheld** your objection and this Crown Road will be retained as Crown Road.

In relation to Road Closing Application W385592 and an additional Crown Road both adjoining the western boundary of Lot 211 DP562217, it appears from aerial imagery that this section of Crown Road appears to be unused and unformed.

Investigations have found that there is Public access to the Goobarragandra River from Junction Bridge approximately 4km to the West, Little River Bridge approximately 2km to the East, and the Crown Road adjoining western boundary of Lot 213 DP750972 (that will be retained for public access as advised above), appears to be approximately 800 metres to the East.

After assessment of all submissions received, the Minister's delegate has **overruled** your objection for the whole of the Crown Road adjoining western boundary of Lot 211 DP562217 and this section of Crown Road has been approved for closure.

Submission regarding Crown road closure application W401823 at Batlow

Regarding road closure application W401823 being considered for Crown Roads within and adjoining properties south of Herrings Road Batlow, east of Gedyes Road Batlow, North of Heatleys Road Batlow and West of Bago State Forest and Gilmores Creek (File Ref: 13/09323).

I am pleased to advise that after assessment of all submissions received, the Minister's delegate has **upheld** your objection and the road east of Lot C DP900713 will be retained as crown road.

Submission regarding Crown road closure application W396569 at Bombowlee

Regarding road closure application W396569 being considered for Crown Roads within and adjoining properties from 116-246 Lacmalac Road, Bombowlee (File Ref: 13/04110).

I am pleased to advise that after assessment of all submissions received, the Minister's delegate has upheld your objection and the road east of Lot 16 DP396569 will be retained as crown road.

Some members sought to object via e-mail and this had been rejected with Lands insisting on postal objections. This position has been changed now and future objections will be able to be submitted via email. I'll keep you apprised of future actions.

Chicken Wings in Spicy Sauce

Place required amount of chicken pieces in baking dish, mix together:

- 3 tblsp melted butter
- 3 tblsp Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tsp curry powder
- ½ tsp of oregano

- 1 clove garlic crushed
- 1 crumbled chicken cube

Max's Memorial Gathering

As advised at the AGM, CAA has lost a real stalwart member and ex-President with the passing of Max Huntington. Max didn't want a religious service so a Memorial Gathering was conducted after a private cremation. Ian, Bruce, Stefan and Bill were able to attend and pay our respects to Max's widow Jill and their family. An extract of the 'order of service' is below:

THE LIFE AND TIMES OF MAX HUNTINGTON By Jill Huntington

Max was born in Randwick on the 8 July 1933 to Effie White Huntington (nee Crawford) and Hethersett Roland Huntington. Rol was a surveyor and Civil Engineer, who settled at Mittagong shortly after Max was born. So Max grew up in a country town, did all the naughty (shooting out the street lights with the local policeman's son) and hair-raising (going down the shale mines) things that country boys do.

The family moved to Redcliffe when Max was in his mid-teens. He attended Nudgee College for his last two years at school and it was there that he met his life-long friend Terry Boyle. He and Terry both studied Engineering at Queensland University.

They say that good engineers are born, not made. Intelligent, questioning, logical, pragmatic – that was Max. And if he sometimes came over as detached and argumentative and as subtle as a sledge hammer – then that too was Max.

In their early days in Melbourne Max and his friends spent many hours building and re-building their cars. As a group they attended Hill Climbs, the Armstrong 500 and the Australian Grand Prix at Albert Park. Max often helped out his racing driver friends as pit manager or head time-keeper. There are those who might say that he drove as though he too was on the race track. Others likened his exploits in the Jeep on outback roads to the trials of army vehicles at the Monegeeta trials and proving ground.

He loved water skiing, houseboating, outback travel and took up fly fishing with his usual enthusiasm. He joined the Canberra Anglers Club, spending some years as the Club's president and was awarded Life Membership at this year's AGM.

Even after he retired he put his engineering and practical skills to good use with the TADACT (Technical Aid for the Disabled). It's somewhat ironic that his last contact with TADACT was to request them to build him a ramp.

He spent several years on the committee of the Hackett Community Association and was its Deputy Chair for two years.

Max was very much a product of his times, who nonetheless embraced many of the "softer", more modern traits – an affectionate and demonstrative husband and father and a loyal friend. A large chunk of me has gone with him.
