

Gaden Trout Hatchery - Tri Annual Report

Completion of Fingerling Releases

January 2019 to May 2019

Climatic Conditions

A hot and dry summer was seen here at Gaden, with river temperatures reaching 28.5 °C for several days over the Australia Day long weekend. Rainfall for January-April was 177mm, which was well below average. The Thredbo River ran very low over this period (lowest .234m), with only one minor flood experienced in late March. There was a few frosts seen in late April, with the river level and temperature remaining relatively low.

Infrastructure

Power supply to earthen ponds has been completed as well as 4 extra pond aerators have been purchased to combat low oxygen levels and algal blooms in the summer periods.

The shared trail between Thredbo and the Gaden hatchery has been completed, 22 poplar trees in the picnic area have been removed due to safety concerns and to make way for the trail bridge. The bridge that connects the trail to the Gaden hatchery picnic area was started in late March. The bridge is reported to be open for use by June. A portion of the picnic area is fenced off to the public so bridge works can be completed. Anglers can get to the Thredbo River through a marked off area within the hatchery grounds.

Gaden staff have been busy setting up a recirculating aquaculture system inside the hatching room. These systems are temperature controlled and assist staff in producing larger fingerlings. It will also be used to protect broodstock from heat stress in those hot summer periods.

A new concrete slab has been poured adjacent to the hatching room. The slab will allow staff to utilize spare grow out tanks which would otherwise be in storage due to a lack of space inside the hatching room.

Fish Stocking

Due to the extreme weather conditions, emergency fish releases for Lake Jindabyne and Lake Eucumbene were completed over the Australia Day long weekend. A portion of these fish would usually be tagged, but the weather conditions prevented this for Lake Eucumbene, however a small portion of Jindabyne's rainbow trout were tagged successfully. We saw large scale fish kills over this time, with an estimated 20-30,000 fish lost. We have put extra measures in place to minimise mortalities in the future. A fish kill report has been compiled by DPI staff and is attached in the email.

The staff at Gaden have used heated water and altered feeding regimes to successfully grow out larger rainbow trout fingerlings. These fish which were around 30 grams, were tagged and released into Lake Jindabyne in Early April.

Approximately 600 1+ year old Rainbow trout and 100 1+ year old Atlantic salmon was externally tagged and released into Khancohan Pondage in mid April DPI is developing longer term stocking strategies for waters v reported
