


## Stuff in my In Box


Meanwhile, Paul managed to snag a nice Murray Cod on the final day of the season, before he headed to warmer climes.








Jayden spotted an apparent change to ACT Regs.


# Long Term Program of Events Not Formally Part of CAA Events
