
Buckenderra Trip 21-23 March

NSWCFA Mini-Conference – Sat 8 Mar

Lachy

The NSW Council of Freshwater Anglers (NSW CFA) held a mini-conference at the Gaden Trout Hatchery just outside of Jindabyne. CAA was well represented with Bill, Angie, Micheal, Bob, Greg W, Neil and Lachy in attendance.

Notes from the meeting follow, but the key highlight was a tour of the upgraded hatchery. Trout at least as long as your arm going into a frenzy over feed pellets was an angler's delight... and pure agony as many would have loved to cast a line in, but knew that you couldn't. That said, the advice from the site manager at Gaden that there is a plan to open up one of the ponds to 'pay to fish' is truly tempting. I dare say there would be a few club members who wouldn't mind paying a few bucks to try out their newly tied fly on a monster brown or rainbow.

NSW CFA – Gary Bickford (President) and Peter Gibson (Senior Vice President)

- Discussed membership arrangements. Explained that CFA is a self-funded association of associations/clubs. Membership numbers are limited due to this framework as not all anglers wish to become members of clubs. This constrains the total number of anglers that NSW CFA can represent and lobby for at a political level.
- Explained the Victorian VR Fish membership framework which includes:
 - Subscribers no cost and receives monthly e-newsletter. Over 55,000 subscribers.
 - Individual Members no cost or \$25/year with voting rights. Just under 400 members.
 - Fishing Clubs and Associations no cost with voting rights. 161 clubs currently registered.
 - Affiliate Organisations no cost with voting rights. However, the organisation must have aligned and supporting purposes to those of VRFish and be a not-for-profit, charitable, research or public benevolent organisation. Currently 10 organisations registered.
- With a permanent staff of three (CEO, comms, admin), a good quality website and representing a significant number of people has enabled VR Fish to lobby effectively with the VIC Government and secure funding for various projects.
- NSW CFA has undertaken to investigate the VR Fish model with a view to potentially adopting something similar.

Gaden Trout Hatchery – Mitchel Elkins

- Gave an overview of the hatchery including history, current upgrades and capabilities and future plans, which include the possibility of a 'pay to fish' in a specific hatchery pond. He also spoke of environmental rehabilitation of waterways. A tour of the hatchery was then conducted.
- It was noted that there were numerous and sizeable Brook trout in the newer recirculation system tanks. Mitchel advised that the Brook trout are stocked into Three Mile Dam near Kiandra, Dry Dam near Cabramurra and into Lake Jindabyne.

Upper Murrumbidgee River Rehabilitation Project – Antia Brademann and Michelle Janes

- The ecological decline of the river has become more evident since 2019.
- This was highlighted during a virtual tour of the Murrumbidgee River from Tantangara Dam to Bredbo highlighting issues and actions taken or underway to remediate the waterway and associated riparian areas.

Fisheries Research and Development Corporation – Gary Bickford on behalf of Kris Cooling (absent)

Australian Trout Foundation – Paul Stolz

Monaro Acclimatisation Society – Kerry Pfeiffer

- Essentially the above representatives presented an overview of their organisation's efforts to work collaboratively on riparian and in-stream habitat recovery. An emphasis on looking after the fishery (habitat) and the fish will largely look after themselves.
- Highlighting the ability for the coexistence of trout and other species if the habitat is in balance.

Restoring Lost Fisheries – Luke Pearce

- Focus on Trout Cod and Macquarie Perch.
- Note the name realignment from Trout Cod to Bluenose to avoid misunderstandings.
- Fisheries Research and Development Corporation (FRDC) and Victorian Fisheries Authority (VFA or colloq. Vic Fisheries) are seeking to be able to breed Macquarie Perch. Promising results thus far with the captive breeding program.
- Trout (not trout cod/bluenose) relocation was discussed, but it was heartening to note that Luke's tone regarding trout had mellowed from the Public Consultation meeting held at Queanbeyan on 16 Nov 23. There appears to be a greater acceptance that the two species can co-exist.



Fishing conditions are now wonderful and the fish are doing a great job of educating us. It's good to be here!




Long Term Program of Events Not Formally Part of CAA Events
